Finding the Whole in the Care of the Patient Nadya Dimitrov, DPM, PA-C, DFAAPA

An altruistic calling and compassionate listening are qualities that have long been considered part of the healthcare professional's credentials. Compassionate listening has deep roots in the spiritual realm, the realm of meaning. Healthcare professionals often turn to other specialists to navigate this realm. However there is an inherent resilience at the core of our engagement as healers. How do we capture the essence of trust in the relationship with the patient? Her current scholarship is focused on palliative and serious illness patient management training, telehealth/telemedicine and interprofessional education.
