Housing & Infrastructure Updates

- Residential Projects: The committee received updates on Seawolves Village, noting that completion is delayed and will not be ready for the Fall 2026 term.
- Long-Term Expansion: Groundbreaking has occurred at Tabler for a new facility expected in Spring 2028. Additionally, plans are being developed for a Public-Private Partnership (P3) project to add 1,000 beds by Fall 2029.
- Housing Policy: Current housing availability remains tied to enrollment trends. While the university retains the right to implement a residency radius for first-year students if necessary, the current goal is to offer housing to as many first-year students as possible without implementing such restrictions.
- Graduate Housing: Chapin Apartments continues to serve as a resource for elevating specific housing issues.

Academic & Global Initiatives

- Online Learning: Discussion focused on the President's interest in reintegrating fully online majors into the university's long-term strategic planning.
- Student Connection: A key priority is balancing online academic growth with maintaining a strong sense of community and connection to Stony Brook for all students.
- Experiential & International Growth: The committee is exploring the return of robust study abroad programs, the integration of experiential learning into the curriculum, and potential collaborations with international universities.

Campus Improvements & Impact Funding

- Fast Impact Fund: The President has announced a one-time fund for equipment, renovations, and technology projects (up to \$300,000 each) that provide immediate positive campus impact.
- Student Affairs Proposals: The department is brainstorming proposals for this fund, including mobile equipment for outdoor events and enhancements to student social spaces.
- East Campus Enhancements: Updates were provided on the "Show Red East" initiative, which includes the development of a Student Life office and social spaces within the Health Sciences Center (HSC).

Student Engagement & Safety

- Athletics & Involvement: Efforts are underway to better connect student organizations with Athletics to increase student presence and performance opportunities at university games.
- Campus Access: Discussions are ongoing regarding streamlining access protocols for students and employees between West Campus and the HSC.
- Campus Safety: The University Police Department (UPD) continues to offer "Run, Hide, Fight" training. The committee discussed the importance of these protocols in light of recent incidents at other institutions.
